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What to Expect: Central Okanagan Child and Youth Mental Health Services

The Ministry for Children and Family Development provides a wide range of services for children and youth with mental health concerns through Child and Youth Mental Health (CYMH). Some of these services are provided directly by CYMH clinicians, others are provided by community agencies, working under contract for CYMH. All of these government-funded services are free to BC residents. A mature minor can access these services without parental consent under the Infants Act. Use of these services is voluntary.

WHEN A REFERRAL IS MADE

- For most families connecting with CYMH begins with a phone call to the centre at (250)861-7301. Young
 people themselves, their parents or guardians are encouraged to call directly.
- Third party referrals (i.e. physicians, school counsellors) are accepted via phone or fax as well. Consent from the parent/guardian of the child or from the youth themselves must be received prior to making the referral.
- Once a third party referral is received a letter goes out to the parent/guardian of the child or to the youth
 which is also Cc to the referring source. This letter indicates that a referral has been received and requests
 that the parent/guardian or youth give CYMH a call.
- An intake worker will respond within 48 hours of receiving a call from the parent/guardian or youth except for where there is an immediate concern for the child/youth's safety (i.e. actively suicidal/psychotic) in which case the intake worker will make contact right away.
- Upon initial contact with the intake worker a BCFPI (Brief Child and Family Phone Interview) is conducted.
 This is a basic screening tool that gives a snapshot of what some of the mental health concerns might be.
- Once the BCFPI is completed the child/youth is scheduled for a face to face Initial Assessment with a clinician. The Initial Assessment is used to identify the child/youth's challenges/strengths and determine if there are any mental health concerns and/or if any support is needed within the family system. For example, family therapy.

THE INITIAL ASSESSMENT

- There will likely be a wait for the Initial Assessment. The Average wait time is 4-6 weeks.
- A mental health clinician will meet with the child/youth and the parents and may request permission to see records (medical, school, etc.) or consult with a school counsellor and/or family physician.
- Once the mental health clinician finishes their Initial Assessment they write up a report with their impressions
 and recommendations and send the file along to the screening team.

THE SCREENING TEAM

- The Screening Team is a multi-disciplinary team of professionals that meets once a week to review the Initial Assessments. The Screening Team reviews approximately 10-15 cases per week.
- The Screening Team makes the final decision regarding disposition. This may include an urgent assignment to a CYMH Clinician or being placed on a waitlist with CYMH.
- The Screening Team may also refer to a contracted agency with CYMH or other community resource.
- After the disposition is decided a clinician contacts the parent/guardian of the child or contacts the youth directly with the outcome. A letter is also mailed out and is Cc to the referring source.

WAITLIST

- Due to the high demand for CYMH services the Average wait for services is anywhere from 3 to 6 months. A
 child/youth placed on the waitlist at CYMH is prioritized based on the acuity of their symptoms.
- If at any time the symptoms of a child/youth worsens the youth or parent/guardian of the child is encouraged to call CYMH for support.

Child and Youth Mental Health Services

INDIVIDUAL/GROUP THERAPY, PSYCHO-EDUCATION AND FAMILY SUPPORT

• Our CYMH team is made up of counsellors, clinical social workers, nurses, a psychologist and a psychiatrist. We provide assessment, individual therapy, group therapy, family support and psycho-education. CYMH clinicians use Evidenced Based Interventions (practices that research has proven to be effective) such as Cognitive Behavioral Therapy (CBT) and Interpersonal Psychotherapy (IPT). Treatment may also involve the use of medications in addition to therapy. Medication is prescribed through the family doctor or our CYMH psychiatrist. It is a requirement that the client be actively involved with a CYMH clinician to access psychiatry. Psychiatric sessions are limited and are therefore only available to clients of CYMH. CYMH does not have the capacity to accept referrals where the only service requested is a psychiatric assessment.

BIFROST

 Bifrost is an attachment-based program designed to provide the youth and their families with an intensive short-term, multi-modal, multi-systemic intervention. The Program has three main components; family therapy, Connect Parenting Group, and individual support to the youth in four areas (education, vocation, recreation and social/family life).

ADHD CLINIC

• The ADHD clinic is a designed to provide assessment and treatment assistance for parents/caregivers of children and youth, ages 6-18. Referrals are made where there is a question about the ADHD diagnosis, there is an ADHD diagnosis with confounders or co-morbidities complicating treatment and/or there is an ADHD diagnosis where treatment trials have not been successful in resolving symptoms. Referrals must be made by a physician or pediatrician. A mental health clinician can recommend the ADHD clinic however this recommendation must be followed up with a letter of support by the family's physician or pediatrician.

SCHOOL -BASED CLINICIANS

• The Central Okanagan has 5 clinicians that work out of the middle schools and alternative schools. The School-Based Clinicians receive the majority of their referrals directly from the school counsellor/school-based team. In partnership with MCFD, School District 23 helps to fund these positions.

GROUPS

- TNT Group: TNT (Teens Needing Tools for Life) is a psycho-educational group that uses Dialectical Behavioral Therapy. There are two groups, one for high school and one for middle school age youth. This group is for youth who have challenges with self-regulation, mood, relationships, impulsivity, self-harm and suicidality. Due to the high risk potential of this population the youth must be actively involved with a CYMH clinician in order to attend.
- **Take Charge Group**: Take Charge is a psycho-educational group that uses Cognitive Behavioral Therapy. The group is for children (typically ages 9 to 12) whose challenges with anxiety interfere with their daily functioning. The child is referred by the screening team. This group also has a parent/guardian component.
- PAK (Parenting ADHD Kids): This is a psycho-educational group for parents with children ages 6-16 who have been diagnosed with ADHD. Using Collaborative Problem Solving this group provides a framework to helps parent/guardians to understand the impact of ADHD on their child/youth's functioning and increase their capacity to effectively parent.
- **GGAK (Games Group for ADHD):** This group is for children ages 7-10 that have been diagnosed with ADHD. It focuses on improving self-management through social games.
- Collaborative Problem Solving: This is a psycho-educational group that helps parent/guardians incorporate
 Collaborative Problem Solving skills into their parenting style. It provides a framework to help the parent/guardian focus
 on "unsolved problems" and "lagging skills" so that these problems can be resolved. There is no need to go through
 the intake process for parents to participate in this group.
- **Connect:**This is a 10-week psycho-educational group for parents/guardians of teens that help them to apply an attachment lens when interacting with their teen and to explore the meaning behind their teen's behavior. There is no need to go through the intake process for parents to participate in this group.

CHILD AND YOUTH MENTAL HEALTH CONTRACTS AND PARTNERSHIPS

MCFD-CYMH provides funding to several community agencies in order to meet the needs of children, youth and families. As well CYMH is involved in initiatives that are funded solely by community partners. Below is a list of these services.

ARC PROGRAMS LTD.

• **Family-Based Treatment Program:** This program provides in-home support and wraparound services to children/youth and their families. This program is an outreach community based mental health service designed to reduce the risk to children/youth and build capacity within families. Referrals to this program are made through CYMH.

THE BRIDGE YOUTH AND FAMILY SERVICES

• **Family Counselling:** This program provides support to families that are experiencing emotional and/or behavioral challenges with their child/youth through both in-home and office based meetings. Referrals to this program are made through CYMH and other MCFD partners.

KELOWNA FAMILY CENTRE

- Child, Youth and Family Counselling: This program provides Individual and/or family counselling to children/youth and their families due to challenges within the home and/or at school. This program also provides support to children/youth with mild to moderate mental health concerns. Referrals to this program are made through CYMH.
- <u>Sexually Intrusive Behavior Program:</u> This program provides specialized counselling for children under the age of 12 that exhibit sexually intrusive behaviors where no disclosure of sexual abuse has been made. Referrals to this program are made through CYMH.

THE ELIZABETH FRY SOCIETY

<u>SAIP (Sexual Abuse Intervention Program):</u> This program provides treatment and support to children, youth and nonoffending family members where there has been a disclosure of sexual abuse and/or sexual assault. Referrals to this
program can be made directly to the Elizabeth Fry Society.

RESPITE

• Respite: This contract provides respite to parents/guardians whose child/youth is actively being seen by at CYMH clinician. This includes day time support as well as overnights. Referrals to this program are made through CYMH.

BOYS AND GIRLS CLUB

• <u>Outreach Mental Health:</u>This program provides mental health services to high risk youth that are not willing or able to access mainstream services. Outreach is provided to the youth making it easier for the youth to obtain services. Referrals to this program are made by MCFD CYMH, MCFD Youth Response Team and The Boys and Girls Club.

INTERIOR HEALTH

- Youth Crisis Response: This program provides urgent response and assessment to children, youth and families that present to KGH with a mental health concern. Recommendations may include an admission to Kelowna General Hospital (KGH) or if the child/youth is able to return home, recommendations to ensure the child/youth's safety. Psychiatric follow-up is available through this program. Access to this program is through KGH or through the family's physician.
- <u>Hospital Liaison:</u>This program is available to children and youth that are admitted to KGH regarding a mental health concern. A nurse works with the family to ensure a smooth transition between discharge from the hospital and obtaining mental health services and support within the community.

SCHOOL-DISTRICT 23

• <u>Lifes Avers:</u>Lifes Avers is a youth suicide preventative program that is funded by School District 23. Clinicians from CYMH work with high school students to provide peer support to students through school presentations and resiliency groups.
