

SERVICE DETAILS

Provides medical care and emotional support to anyone who has been sexually assaulted * provides options for your care: you can be examined and treated for your injuries, given medications for sexually transmitted infections, receive a pregnancy test and be provided with the morning after pill * samples can be collected for a police investigation * all services are free of charge

If you, or someone you know, has been sexually assaulted within the last 7 days and would like to seek medical care, you can access the SART by advising the nurse at the triage desk in the Emergency Department that you would like to see a SART physician * you are welcome to bring a friend or family member to support you * staff from the Elizabeth Fry Society, a community service organization that provides ongoing victim services for women who have been sexually assaulted, are also available to accompany you at the hospital * it is your choice whether or not to report to the police; we will respect your decisions

Provides 24/7 low-barrier emergency shelter for homeless women, youth and children * offers free services including: a 30 day stay for those who are homeless, a warm, clean and safe non-judgmental environment, three nutritious meals a day, 24 hour on-site support, individualized case planning (e.g. assistance in finding housing, employment, accessing medical treatment, referrals to alcohol/drug treatment programs), laundry facilities, referrals to NOW Canada programs and other community services * partners with Kelowna Gospel Mission to provide additional 'overflow' beds for those who are unable to get a bed at the AG House * during the coldest months of the year, also provides mats which offers additional shelter in the winter

Provides a voluntary resource for youth ages 13-18 who are homeless (absolute or relative) or at risk of homelessness and have no safe alternatives * youth may refer themselves to the program or be referred by anyone in the community, including MCFD and other youth serving organizations * operates on a first come first serve basis and accommodates up to 10 youth per evening * males and females are housed in separate areas of the shelter * all attempts will be made to connect youth with another community resources, including but not limited to MCFD After-hours Social Workers if the Shelter is full

Offers a specialized inpatient program for youth ages 12-17 struggling with significant psychiatric symptoms such as psychosis, mood disorders, or anxiety disorders that require an extended stay for assessment and treatment planning * evaluations are carried out by multidisciplinary team and require the active participation of the patient, their family and community mental health support services * goal is to complete comprehensive assessment, initiate and provide treatment planning and provide recommendations for follow-up

Resident of Interior Health region * significant psychiatric symptoms beyond assessment or treatment scope of community resources * must have completed a recent psychiatric assessment

Provides an outreach community based mental health counselling service designed to support children/youth and their families to build their capacity to manage complex mental health issues that are affecting individual and family functioning * services are delivered in collaboration with the MCFD Child and Youth Mental Health teams, Psychiatry, and other community support services identified by the family, are offered in the communities of the North, Central, and South Okanagan * offers intensive in-home family and individual counselling to support Parent Capacity, Emotional Stability, Family Coping Strategies, Interpersonal/Life Skills, and Natural/Community Supports

SERVICE DETAILS

Provides specialized mental health consultation and services to individuals 14 years of age and older who have both an intellectual developmental disorder and a mental health disorder * a specialized team of multidisciplinary mental health professionals provides respectful and individualized assessment, intervention, and education services for adolescents and adults with co-existing intellectual developmental disorders and complex mental health needs * works collaboratively with clients, families, caregivers and other supportive services to optimize individual well-being and quality of life * support is voluntary and therefore a client can refuse services at any time

Must be eligible for CLBC or CYSN services and be diagnosed with an intellectual disability * not all people with a low IQ require DDMH services * tertiary services offered by DDMHS are accessed if the complexity of the clients presentation makes it difficult for them to be served by primary and secondary mental health services such as Child and Youth Mental Health, a family practice physician, or Adult Mental Health

Application: Those receiving services through CLBC or CYSN, a referral may be completed by a CLBC facilitator or CYSN social worker * individuals may also be referred by their family physician, pediatrician, Interior Health Child Assessment Network, hospital, a registered psychologist or Mental Health and Substance Use Services, provided they:

- are 14 years or older
- have an intellectual developmental disorder (as defined by the Diagnostic and Statistical Manual of Mental Disorders, fifth edition) with an IO under 70 and low adaptive functioning
- have developed an intellectual developmental disorder during the developmental period
- have a mental health disorder and/or,
- requires a mental health assessment due to a serious emotional, psychological, or psychiatric condition

Referrals are reviewed by the DDMHS team to determine if the referral meets the program mandate * if a referral is not deemed appropriate, a team member will contact the referring party to offer alternative support options for the individual that may be available in the community

Offers a short-term program providing mental health services to high risk youth 12-18 years of age with psychiatric issues who are not willing or not able to access mainstream mental health services * works collaboratively with youth to develop and implement a treatment plan * ongoing monitoring and evaluation is provided as well as education * makes appropriate referrals to community mental health resources including physicians, child psychiatrists, Adult Mental Health, Kelowna General Hospital and Child and Youth Mental Health. Outreach Mental Health * provides crisis intervention when required
