### Making the Holidays Dietary Friendly

There is no question that the Holidays can represent a wonderful opportunity for joy and quality time spent with friends, family, loved ones, and of course, yummy foods! However, as a Type 1 Diabetic, I have found the Holidays to be a difficult time in enjoying yummy foods with my loved ones from time to time.

Whether one is living with Type 1 Diabetes like myself, or another condition which entails dietary and health restrictions, navigating the Holidays can pose challenges and feelings of frustration. Nonetheless, I have learned that there are ways in which I can participate in and enjoy all the delicious foods the Holidays have to offer!

I was diagnosed with Type 1 Diabetes eleven and a half years ago, at the age of twelve. This diagnosis presented new and overwhelming challenges, many of which impacted my carbohydrate intake. I felt restricted and limited for a while, and struggled to navigate these changes.



When the Holidays rolled around, these restrictions and challenges felt even greater. As a twelve-year-old kid, I remember all I truly wanted was to be able to enjoy my mom's homemade Christmas sugar cookies that she had been making ever since I can remember! I realized it wasn't just about a "cookie," but rather how much I cherished the special recipe within my family, the joy I felt helping my mom make the cookies, and sharing them with friends and family.

Thus, with the help of my mom, we realized that no matter what dietary or health restrictions were in place, I deserved to enjoy the Holidays to the fullest, including the making and consumption of yummy treats!



I have my mom, Shona, to thank for being so accommodating of me, as she took the time to calculate the total grams of carbohydrates in her sugar cookies so that I would be able to enjoy them AND ensure my Diabetes remained in check. Eleven and a half years later, I am happy to say that my mom and I come together and make these cookies every year.

Something that once felt like a challenge has now become a special Holiday tradition with my mom. Today, I am happy to share this Diabetic Friendly recipe with my community and hope that you have fun giving these a try! (I promise, they are delicious and so fun to make!). Whether it be Type 1 Diabetes, or another condition imposing dietary and health restrictions, I hope this story inspires you to discover new ways to enjoy the Holidays and perhaps form new traditions with your own loved ones!

#### Shona & Dana's Sugar Cookie Recipe:

Combine ¾ cup of butter, 1 cup of sugar, 2 eggs, and 1 teaspoon of vanilla. Mix well using an electric mixer/blender.

Add 2 ½ cups of flour, 1 teaspoon of baking soda, and 1 teaspoon of salt.

Chill dough for at least 1 hour.

Once dough has been chilled, sprinkle flour on a clean countertop surface. Using a rolling pin, roll out the dough 1/8 inches thick. Use favourite cookie cutter to achieve desired cookie shape.

Using a baking sheet lined with parchment paper, bake at 400°F for 10 minutes.

Allow cookies to fully cool. Ice cookies using 1 tablespoon of Duncan Hines Butter Cream per cookie. (Optional: add food colouring of choice to icing and top each cookie with sprinkles of choice).



Nutritional Information:

Total grams of carbohydrates for cookie dough = 430g. Divide by number of cookies to determine the grams of carbs per cookie. (E.g., 430g  $\div$  30 cookies = 14g of carbs/cookie).

Total grams of carbohydrates for 1 tablespoon of Duncan Hines Butter Cream icing = 12g. If using icing, add 12g of carbs to each cookie. (E.g., 14g of carbs/cookie + 12g icing = 26g of carbs/cookie.)



The Ukrainian Christmas celebration begins on Christmas Eve, which is on January 6th in the Ukraine. Family members cook Christmas dinner consisting of 12 fasting dishes that symbolize 12 apostles. The main dish at the festive table is kutia – a mix of boiled grains, honey, nuts, poppy seeds, dried fruits, and other toppings. Kutia is the most important dish at the Christmas dinner. Eating this dish on Christmas Eve programmed the following year for a good harvest, livestock and procreation.

Christmas Eve (Holy Eve) is marked by **traditional family gatherings** in the evening in Ukraine – the so-called Sviata Vecheria ('Holy Dinner'). The festivities start with the appearance of the first star in the sky, though

all preparations traditionally start from the very dawn. The rituals of Christmas Eve are dedicated to God, to the welfare of the family, and to the remembrance of the ancestors. With the appearance of the first star, which is believed to be the Star of Bethlehem, the family gathers to begin supper. The father offers each member of the family kutia. He then leads the family in prayer. After the prayer, the father extends his best wishes to everyone with the greeting.

#### CAROLING: Koliadky and Shchedrivky

There are two main groups of Christmas songs in Ukraine: the **koliadky**, whose name is probably derived from the Latin "calendae" meaning the first day of the month. The second group of Christmas songs is called **shchedrivky**. Caroling was not a simple singing of Christmas songs; it was more of a folk opera. The carolers first had to ask for permission to sing. If the answer was yes, they entered the house and sang carols for each member of the family, even for the smallest child. Koliadky and shchedrivky are the oldest groups of Ukrainian folk songs. They are sung by Ukrainians at Christmas time throughout the world.

Caroling required extensive preparation. Each group had a leader. One member dressed as a goat. Another as a bag carrier, the collector of all the gifts people would give them. Yet another carried a six-pointed star attached to a long stick with a light in its center, which symbolized the Star of Bethlehem. In some places, the people even had musical instruments, such as the violin, tsymbaly (dulcimer), or the trembita (a wooden pipe about 8-10 feet long, used in the Carpathian mountains by the Hutsuls).
